Purpose

To honor the life's work of Paul Guttman and to continue his commitment to the advancement of the alcohol and other drug addiction (AoD) field and his service to those in need of care by offering training and educational opportunities for both career-minded individuals in the AoD workforce, as well as individuals in recovery seeking to advance their education in an AoD-related field.

Eligibility

- Current ADAMH/ADAS/CMH Board staff and ODADAS-certified AoD prevention and treatment program staff who have a desire to advance their education in an AoD-related field.
- Alumni of ODADAS-certified programs or drug courts who are in recovery and have a desire to advance their education in an AoD-related field.

Nomination and Selection Process

Nominated by the Executive Director of an ADAMH/ADAS/CMH Board Director. Nominations must be made on the Paul Guttman Scholarship Fund Nomination Form available through OACBHA.

NOMINATIONS DUE November 4, 2011

Selection

Selection Committee will be comprised of the OACBHA CEO and two Board Directors appointed by the Chair of the AoD Division each award period.

The Selection Committee will consider the following criteria in making an award:

- Professional Goals
- AoD related experiences (e.g. Contributions to the field and/or success in completing an ODADAS-certified program or drug court).
- Obstacles overcome
- Unique financial circumstances
- Passion for recovery and addictions field

Initial Awards and Funds Available

Two awards of up to a \$1,000 each per award period, depending on program costs.

Awards announced at the OACBHA Annual General Membership Meeting on November 30, 2011.
