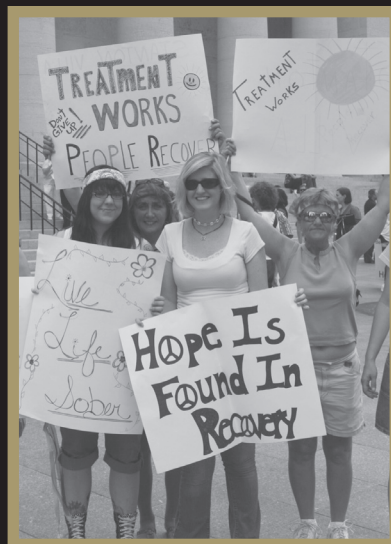

Facts

- 2 out of 3 Ohioans state that they are impacted by a friend or family member with an addiction and/or mental illness. (OACBHA Survey, 2010)
- The Ohio Business Roundtable estimates that improving the diagnosis of depression could lead to \$350-\$450 million per year in increased productivity for Ohio's employers.
- In any given year, 1 in 4 Ohioans has a diagnosable mental illness and 10% of Ohioans have a substance abuse problem or addiction. (NIMH and NSDUH)
- The Ohio Department of Taxation estimates that for each employed Ohioan, the combined state and local annual average tax gain is approximately \$2,500.
- The average national cost of substance abuse treatment is roughly \$1,600. This investment returns a \$11,487 benefit to society. (SAMHSA)
- Each day, nearly four Ohioans die because of drug-related overdoses. And in Ohio, since 2007, there have been more deaths from overdose than from motor vehicle crashes. (OHA and ODH)
- Ohio suicides have reached a 10 year high. (ODH)
- The total Medicaid cost of an individual with a substance abuse problem who receives treatment is 50% less than for an addicted individual who does not receive treatment. (NEOUCOM)
- Hospitalizing a person with a mental illness costs 3-5 times more per year than treating them in the community. (ODMH and ODJFS data)
